HEART OF ACADIAN HERITAGE

Moncton is the largest city in the province of New Brunswick and is the fastest-growing urban region in Atlantic Canada. It is a warm, welcoming, cosmopolitan city with a friendly atmosphere and high quality of life. Approximately 40% of Greater Moncton's population is bilingual - French/English, which is due to the area's Acadian history, while neighbouring city of Dieppe is almost 80% francophone. Moncton offers a wonderful range of cultural and recreational possibilities and is in close proximity to two national parks and beautiful warm water beaches.

Notable features:

- Largest city in the province of New Brunswick, which is the only officially bilingual province in Canada (English/French)
- Mostly Anglophone community, with small French-speaking/bilingual pockets owing to the Acadian heritage
- Considered to be the premier shopping destination of the Maritimes
- Two major national parks within a 1-hour drive
- Strong economy with major industries including education and Healthcare
