Revelstoke is a community rich in natural beauty and is home to some of the best adventure recreation opportunities in the world - and some of Canada's best skiing. The town prides itself on its rich heritage and scenic ambiance, and has lots of community spirit and cultural vibe. Residents take advantage of the aquatic centre (home to salt water pools, a waterslide, an indoor climbing wall and MORE!), a skating rink (home to the Revelstoke Grizzlies Hockey Team), a curling rink, a public library, and the Revelstoke Community Centre. This is a community with a relatively young and homogeneous population with a median age of less than 40 years.

Notable features:

- Revelstoke is quickly developing its tourism sector into an all season playground
- Outdoor adventurers take advantage of the breathtaking scenery in the form of back country hiking, ski touring, heli-skiing, snowmobiling, downhill skiing, snowboarding, river rafting, canoeing and kayaking.
